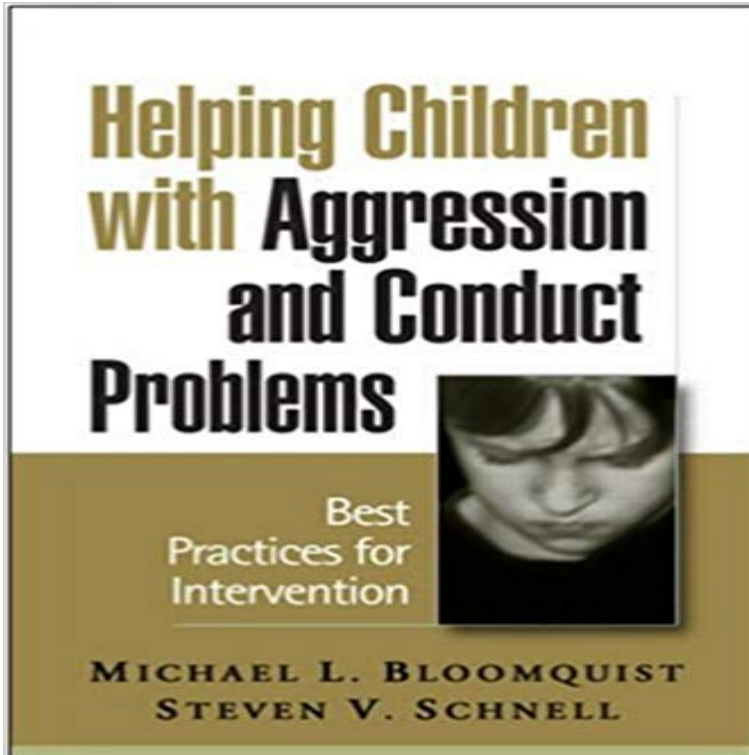


Helping Children with Aggression and Conduct Problems: Best Practices for Intervention
