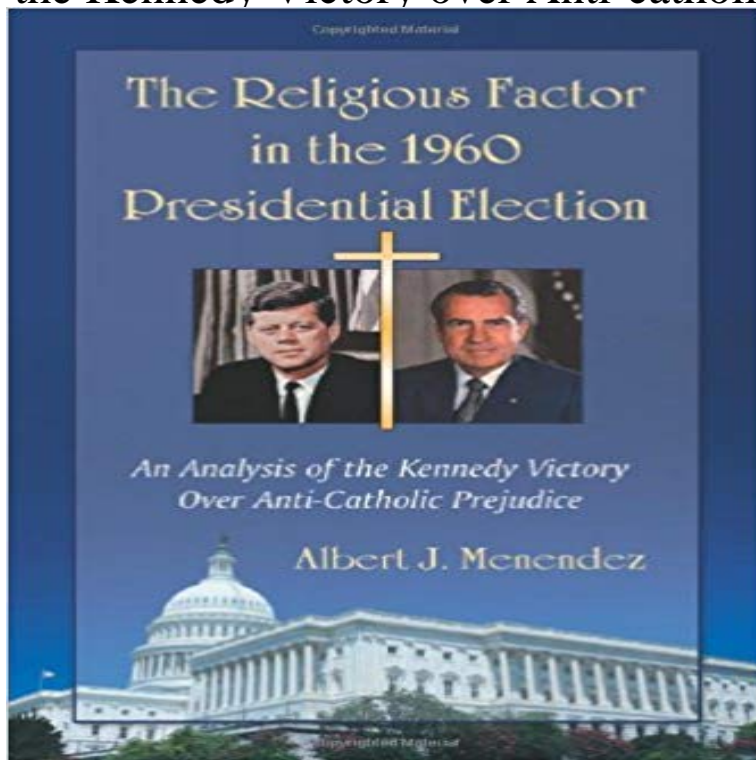


The Religious Factor in the 1960 Presidential Election: An Analysis of the Kennedy Victory over Anti-catholic Prejudice

Kennedy lost more votes than he gained due to his religious affiliation, but by crafting a strong coalition, he prevailed in one of the closest races in presidential history.
